

BRIAN GAYLORD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Brian Gaylord Memorial Scholarship is awarded each year to a worthy Lake City High School senior. In memory of Brian's courage and strength in his fight against leukemia, this scholarship fund was created. During the summer of 1993, David Gaylord, Troy Green, Todd Petersen and Wayne Seger rode their bicycles 4029 miles from Maine to Washington to raise contributions for the fund. The contributions were invested and the resulting interest is awarded as the scholarship. While, sadly, Brian lost his fight against leukemia during his freshman year, his resilience and determination is an inspiration to those who knew him. Brian was never able to attend college or trade school, but this scholarship is intended to help a Lake City student do just that.

General Information

- The scholarship award is variable each year, a minimum award of \$500 can be expected.
- The Cadillac Area Foundation oversees the management of the financial investment to ensure ongoing funds are available each year. The Lake City Education Foundation (LCEF) Committee reviews all applications and selects recipients for each LC scholarship
- Applicants must be Lake City High School Seniors who plan to attend a post-secondary program in a university, college or trade school.
- Applicants must complete the application according to the guidelines provided on the next page. **Deadline for submission is March 1.**
- The Brian Gaylord Scholarship is contingent upon proof of registration for the second term or semester of college or trade school, in addition, earning a cumulative grade point average of no less than 2.0.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

While Brian Gaylord's short life precluded any opportunity to seek higher education, this scholarship is intended to help Lake City students fulfill that opportunity. If you are applying for this scholarship, think about the amazing opportunities that await you and how you might be able to mindfully select a career path that will bring you joy and fulfillment.

The format for this application is an essay that will address areas such as resiliency and determination and how those traits and experiences will help you to attain your educational and career goals.

Your application will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- **Format:**
 - Typed, double-spaced in a 12 point font.
 - Margins should be 1".
 - Length of the essay should be a minimum of two pages, not to exceed four pages.
 - Readability: Minimal (preferably none) spelling, grammatical or sentence structure errors.
- **Content:** Please address the following questions as they pertain to you:
 - Choosing an area of study and making a career plan
 - Why do you wish to further your education?
 - What are your educational and career plans? What academic or technical institution do you plan to attend? What will you study?
 - Personal Experiences and their impact
 - What extra-curricular activities did you participate in during high school and why were they significant to you?
 - Describe your proudest achievement during the last four years. How much did your resiliency and determination factor into this achievement?
 - Financial Need
 - Please explain if you have financial need and if so, why this is important to support your educational goals.
- **Communication of Ideas:** It is important to convey your thoughts and ideas in a clear and articulate manner. For example it is easy to just list accomplishments, but try to expand your thoughts to express some level of analysis of the examples you provide. It is important to reflect how you have grown as a person and where you see yourself in the future.

The application deadline is March 1.
